MA3 Board Spotlight: Frank Sihler, Ranking System

Frank is a current member of the MA3 board of directors and serves on the national ranking committee. Frank is one of MA3's registered instructors who obtained his H4 grading in just two short years. Frank has earned a spot on the podium in several mounted archery competitions all the way to winning the 2019 STAR International Competition. His skills under pressure have earned him the 4th spot overall in our US national ranking system.

Born in Germany, Frank started archery in the 1980s. He competed in numerous traditional 3D archery tournaments there, while he worked on his career as a professional dog musher. The sled dogs brought him to Finland in 1996, where he worked as an outdoor and mushing guide. He also competed in sled dog

races and used his bow and arrow to hunt for small game.

In 2001, Frank married another German, Claudia, and they moved to Alaska, USA. Their recreational dog team grew, and Frank finally fulfilled a lifetime dream, finishing the Iditarod, a 1000-mile sled dog race from Anchorage to Nome.



Archery Tips from Nomad Archery

from Canyon Cappola

Aim Left, then Aim Left Again!

(Of course, everything is opposite for Left Handers)

This is a refrain you will hear me say a lot. And I often get asked 'Why'. The 'Standard' style that we Mounted Archers prefer is all about small sacrifices in the name of speed to allow us a chance at hitting 3 targets at a canter in 14 seconds or less. To that end, we do a lot of things that cause our arrows to drift to the Right, for Right-handers, or to the Left for Left-handers.

- Having the Arrow on the Right side of the Bow rather than 'across' the string will send your arrows to the Right.
- Using Thumb Draw will send your arrows to the Right.
- Sometimes having the odd fletching on the inside and rubbing the bow as it passes will send your arrows to the Right.
- The movement of your horse down the lane will send your arrows to the Right.

All these small changes add up to send your arrows wide to the right of where you will 'think' you are aiming if you try to site down your arrow as you would in standard archery.

So, in short, until your body attunes itself to the 'Instinctive' part of Instinctive Archery....
"Aim Left, and then Aim Left Again!"
